Early voting offers convenience, flexibility and peace of mind.

Voting early in person

- Early voting starts Sept. 21.
- All counties have at least one early voting site, but many have multiple throughout the county.
- You can find your county election office at www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/find-county-election-office.
- If you've registered to vote, you're eligible to vote early.
- If you aren't already registered, you can do that the day you vote.

Voting early by mail

- Apply for a ballot anytime of the year at mnvotes.org. Your ballot will be mailed to you as soon as it is available.
- If you are not registered when you apply for a ballot, you will be mailed a registration form to submit with your ballot.
- You will need a witness when you vote and complete your ballot. The witness can be either a registered Minnesota voter or a notary. Your witness will sign the signature envelope and provide their address—they do not need to view your ballot selections.
- Mail the ballot and forms back right away as your ballot will not count if received after Election Day.
- You can deliver your ballot in person to the election office that sent your ballot before 3 p.m. on Election Day.

REGISTERING TO VOTE IS EASY

In Minnesota, you can register to vote online, by submitting a paper application or in person on Election Day. To avoid wait times at the polls, it's best to register in advance. Advance registration closes on Oct. 15 online or Oct. 16 by mail. After that, you would need to register at your polling location when you go vote.

Eligibility

You can register to vote in Minnesota if you are:

- A U.S. citizen.
- At least 18 years old on Election Day.
- A resident of Minnesota for at least 20 days.
- Finished with all part of any felony sentence.

Registered before? You'll need to register again if you:

- Moved to a new address.
- Changed your address.
- Have not voted at least once in the last four years.

To register, you'll need:

- A Minnesota driver's license or identification card OR the last four digits of your social security number.
- An email address (to register online only).
- Proof of residency (for same-day registration only).
